Study Group Chairs

As the next ICV meeting approaches, it is time to make taxonomic proposals. Looking at the 3000 virus names in NCBI that are not at all recorded at ICTV, there are many new virus species to be considered and proposed to be voted on by ICTV.

Look into the taxonomy database of NCBI for your preferred family/genus and check the list of names and the corresponding sequences. If you want to pull out the names that are not in ICTV, choose the "Taxonomy" database and use the following query replacing geminiviridae by your preferred family name: <geminiviridae[subtree] AND species[rank] NOT loproductvlist[filter]>. You will see a list of names; click on any of those and go to nucleotide database (right box) to get the details.
